

Singularity is pleased to announce a 'fast-track internship' initiative for law students bagging achievements in international moot court competitions.

As an international disputes boutique, Singularity handles cross-border disputes arising out of business relations and projects arising in various parts of the world, and implicating the intersection of applicable laws from these jurisdictions, as well as public international law and international investment law.

With the 'fast-track internship' initiative, Singularity aims to enable law students with keen interest in cross-border disputes to pursue an opportunity to work first-hand on such disputes, and add the learnings from real-world disputes to their existing mooting experience.

Applicants eligible for this initiative would be participating in a separate internship pool, where they would be entitled to:

- (a) a short turnaround on internship applications (within 7 working days);
- (b) an exemption from a technical interview. The internship opportunity would be subject only to a peer interview and scheduling considerations;
- (c) an increased stipend of between Rs. 15,000 Rs. 25,000 /- per month.

Prateek Bagaria (Partner, Singularity Legal) welcomed the new initiative, "Singularity has a long legacy of nourishing young talent with an interest in cross-border disputes. With this initiative, we hope to make it easier for law students to build up this interest with real world experience.
